

- The DFG is the largest independent and self-governing research funding organisation in Germany.
- ▶ It is an **association** under German private law.
- ► It serves **all branches** of science and the humanities by **funding research projects**.






The DFG

- funds research projects in the area of knowledge-driven research,
- maintains dialogue with society, politics and business, advises state institutions,
- supports the transfer of knowledge.

It takes particular care to promote

- international cooperation,
- early career researchers,
- **gender equality and diversity** in science and the humanities.






In 2023,

- the DFG funded around 31,400 running projects with a budget that totalled almost € 4 billion
- the DFG came to approx. 24.000 funding decisions based on peer-reviews by 15.300 reviewers
- Approx. € 1.3 billion of the budget were spent for
 13.325 individual grants projects




Amount of Research Funding Awarded by Scientific Discipline for Each Calendar Year 2020 to 2023 (in €m and %)





Funding Rates* in the Individual Grants Programme by Scientific Discipline 2020 to 2023 (in %)








- Open, bottom-up choice of research topics

Eligibility

Meeting all the requirements for appointment to a long-term professorship



Purpose

To enable outstanding researchers to prepare for a senior academic role



Location

In Germany or abroad



Duration

Max. 5 years





Heisenberg fellowship



Heisenberg professorship



Heisenberg position



Heisenberg temporary substitute position for clinicians

+ flexible research funding or a general allowance (fellowship)





- Individual Research Grant: Funding for project costs/staff etc. (compatible with Heisenberg funding)
- Submission possible any time
- ▶ If you require the Individual Research Grant right at the beginning of your Heisenberg funding period
 - → please submit both applications simultaneously



Total duration: 5 years (60 months) Interim report Start of the second funding period (or after 30 months end of funding) Final report First funding period: 36 months Second funding period: 24 months



Success rateApplications between 2020 and 2023






Eligibility



EligibilityWho is eligible to apply?

Emmy Noether Programme (or other group leaders)

Completed habilitation

Junior professors (with positive evaluations)

Researchers who meet all the requirements for appointment to a long-term professorship

Qualifications equivalent to a habilitation (z.B. publication record, list placement for a professorship etc.)

Foreign researchers

(DFG financed-) post doc positions



EligibilityWho is <u>not</u> eligible to apply?



- ► Tenure track professors (in Germany)
- ► Those with positions equivalent to W2/W3 (positions in Germany)

Other permanent positions (e.g. Akademische Rätin or Akademischer Rat) do not impede the eligibilty

Permanent professors (e.g. associate professors) from abroad are eligible as long as they have not achieved a full professorship yet

► Heisenberg professorship





- Heisenberg fellowship
 - Research at an academic institution in Germany or another country
 - Fellowship (currently €4.450 per month) + general allowance (€250 per month) + childcare allowance + foreign allowance
 - Required documents: A declaration issued by the host institution confirming the position and the core support specific to the project





- Heisenberg position
 - Position (E 14 Stufe 5 to E 15 Stufe 4) und flexible research funding (€1000 per month)
 - Research at an academic institution in Germany or a German academic institution in another country (e.g. Max Planck Institute in Italy)
 - Research stay(s) at foreign academic institutions outside of Germany possible for a maximum of 1/3 of the funding duration (usually 20 months)
 - Required documents: Arbeitgebererklärung (DFG form 41.04; only available in German)





- Heisenberg temporary substitute position for clinicians
 - Funds for temporary substitute (Ä 1 Stufe 2 to Ä 2 Stufe 1) and flexible research funding (€1000 per month)
 - Substitute staff takes over the patient-care responsibilities for the Heisenberg position holder
 - Heisenberg position holder may work full-time or part-time (at least 49%) on the Heisenberg project
 - Required documents: informal letter from current institution (confirming the existing employment relationship and release from patient care); the academic institution must confirm the specific core support required for the project





- Heisenberg professorship
 - Temporary professorship (W2 or W3) and flexible research funding (€1000 per month)
 - The university must give a binding statement that after the DFG funding period ends it will transfer the Heisenberg professorship permanently to its own budget (in case of positive DFG and university mid-term evaluation)
 - Required documents: proof of appointment (e.g. a declaration issued by the employing institution or a certificate of appointment); declaration regarding the continuation of the professorship; declaration regarding the core support specific to the project



- Flexible research funding
 - Examples:





conferences



publication costs (incl. open access)



staff (e.g. research assistants)



Additional funding for publication costs



Should the appropriate publication of your research findings made within the context of the Heisenberg grant call for a book format with high production costs, you may apply for additional funding of up to €5,000 per year. The request must be justified accordingly.







Change of funding type and/or institution

► Change possible any time except for the last year (please reach out for individual advice)



► Multiple changes possible

➤ Change from Heisenberg fellowship to other funding types is possible; change to a Heisenberg fellowship (after you started the grant with another funding type) is not possible





Interruptions

- ➤ You may pause the fund for a maximum of one year
- ► Important: The DFG must approve your interruption plans



Part-time

- ► Reduction possible (up to 50% of a full-time position)
- ► In cases of illness, childcare or other family care duties
- ► Important: The DFG must approve your part-time plans





Extensions

- ► The Heisenberg funding cannot be extended
- ► Exception: cost-neutral extension if cases of interruptions/part-time

- ► Via the DFG's elan-Portal
- ► Processing your application takes around 8 months

- ► Submission of your application
- Are you applying for an Individual Research Grant as well?



- Choosing your Heisenberg funding type (max. 6 months after receiving the congratulations letter)
- ➤ Starting your grant (max. 12 months after receiving the congratulations letter)


- DFG CV template




